FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE ALERT

There are bills making their way through the US Senate (S.3304) and House (HR 3101) which will, if passed, expand the federal mandate for captioned media and accessible phone service to the Internet. As television programs and phone services move to the Internet, the accessibility features and hearing-aid compatibility that users who are deaf or hard of hearing have grown to expect are disappearing. These bills bring accessibility up to date (for users who are blind, as well.) Now is the time to write or email the Idaho congressional delegation and let them know that this legislation is important to you. Here's an easy way to contact elected officials by email: go to www.congress.org, enter your zip code and there you are. Old-fashioned mailing addresses are also provided.
